This organization seeks to create hope, justice, and empowerment with farmworkers and rural families in NY by building community and developing leaders through advocacy, education and the arts. RMM puts their mission into action through five main program areas: Accompaniment (Standing with others). Rural Academy of the People (Nurturing Leadership). Youth Empowerment, Immigrant Legal Rights Project, and Community Good Federal Credit Union (Financial Equity). Some of their many programs include the Youth Arts Group, Overnight Summer Leadership and Day Camps for the children of farmworkers, internships for college students, annual Rural Women's Assemblies, facilitating legislative campaigns, and an annual Harvest Justice Dinner. Due to the current dissolution of the Regional Synod of NY, \$10,000 has been removed from RMM's annual funding. Classis of the Hudson Valley has decided to support this vital mission in our area and needs support from each church within our Classis to help raise this difference. We on the Mission & Outreach Committee encourage you to get behind this mission as you are able.
