Mission & Outreach's June MOM- World Central Kitchen - Gaza

Mission and Outreach are supporting World Central Kitchen and their life saving humanitarian work in Gaza. Since March 2 of this year, Israel has blocked aid from entering Gaza and now nearly half a million men, women and children are on the verge of starvation. We can't even imagine the suffering. Israel has developed, and the United States backs, an aid delivery system that should go into effect the end of May. The United Nations says the plan is not neutral or impartial and is not supporting it. Nonprofits find it suspect as well. As of May 21, 98 trucks filled with supplies entered Gaza. UN officials say aid has so far not reached the people in need. WCK has been in Gaza since the beginning of the war. They not only feed people, but they also train them and set up kitchens in rural areas to be run by locals. WCK has stretched their supplies since the March 2 blockade until May 4. Since then, they have made use of their large cooking vessels to transport and deliver clean water. Their trucks are on the border, waiting to deliver food and supplies. Mission and Outreach would like to support these amazing, generous people again in their mission to feed the hungry. Please join us in prayer for the homeless, tired, starving, bereaved people of Gaza. Let us give thanks again for our overwhelming blessings.
