Duties of an Elder

The elders of our congregation are responsible for the spiritual guidance and discipline of the family of faith. This is achieved through oversight of what is preached and taught, the maintenance of the membership rolls, the visitation of those members who have fallen away from active fellowship with the church, the discipline of those members who do not keep the vows that they made upon joining, and by the offering of the Sacraments in such a manner that they are not abused.

Duties of a Deacon

As a deacon you are called to serve the church and the world in ministries of mercy, service and outreach. To give that service focus and direction, Reformed Church in America deacons concentrate on six areas of ministry:

- 1) Special Individual and Family Concerns
- 2) Stewardship Education and Congregational Giving
- 3) Mission Involvement
- 4) Volunteer Service
- 5) Reformed Church World Service and Hunger Advocacy
- 6) Caring for Creation and Simple Living

The particular committees that need individuals with specific gifts and talents this year are:

Education – this committee works closely with the Coordinator of Children's Ministries, Desiree Albizu, in planning, overseeing and leading the education programs for the children, youths and adults of this congregation.

Mission & Outreach – This committee is responsible for the development, implementation and maintenance of the various mission activities that the congregation participates in. Examples include Mission-of-the-Month, RCA Missionary Support and local concerns.

Property Committee – This committee leads in the area of Property. This includes the maintenance and development of building and grounds. Historically it has lent support in areas of finance & personnel.
